VOLUNTEER AWARDS PROGRAM

<p>Purpose:</p>	<p>To accurately track volunteer time by GTAA members toward conservation improvement and apply this time in qualifying for government and private recognition.</p>
<p>Responsibility:</p>	<p>It is the responsibility of the 2nd Vice President to assure that this program is administered each year and revised as necessary.</p>
<p>Procedure:</p>	<p>A monthly record is to be kept for all activities that qualify for hours towards conservation improvement.</p> <p>It is the responsibility of each member to turn in their Volunteer Hours Report to the 2nd Vice President or his designate.</p> <p>The 2nd Vice President shall accumulate these hours and recognize monthly any members that exceeded 35 hours.</p>
<p>Conditions:</p>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1) In order to qualify you must be an active member in good standing. 2) You must volunteer time at the hatchery or designated volunteer projects or events. Paid remuneration for time spent does not count towards volunteer hours. 3) Yearly duration runs from January 1st until the end of December.
<p>Awards:</p>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1) 35 hours of volunteer work -1 GTAA Hat Pin or broach 2) 50 hours of volunteer work - eligible for year end draw. The Board of Directors will determine the value of this draw each year. 3) At the end of each year, the person voted by the Board of Directors, as showing most enthusiasm in his volunteer activities will be given the Volunteer of the Year award. 4) At the end of each year, the Hatchery Chairman will name one person as Hatchery Volunteer of the Year.
